

- 2. Please verify reservation totals after your 3rd Friday of September head count and adjust your seat totals if necessary. Changes to the initial order are the responsibility of the school. The Grand will accept changes up to six weeks before a performance. Schools will be invoiced based upon their last submitted seat count.
- 3. All school seats with a federal tax-exempt number are \$5.00 each. For every 20 tickets purchased, you will receive one additional free ticket. (Ex: If you order 105 tickets, five tickets will be at no charge). The Grand will invoice schools accordingly.
- 4. Ticket prices for the general public and schools without a federal tax-exempt number are \$6.00 per ticket.
- 5. Initial confirmation of your order will be sent out by regular mail.

- 7. An invoice with additional information is sent out approximately one month before a performance. Payment is due upon receipt to confirm seating arrangements. Loss of seats may occur if payment is not received prior to the performance.


