




13-Story Treehouse

Ordering Instructions

1. List the total number of seats needed for each performance. Total number of seats should include everyone attending (students, teachers, aides, interpreters, chaperones, etc.).
2. Please verify reservation totals after your 3rd Friday of September head count and adjust your seat totals if necessary. Changes to the initial order are the responsibility of the school.
3. All school seats with a federal tax-exempt number are \$5.00 each. For every 20 tickets purchased, you will receive one additional free ticket. (Ex: if you order 105 tickets, five tickets will be at no charge). The Grand will invoice schools accordingly.
4. Ticket prices for the general public and schools without a federal tax-exempt number are \$6.00 per ticket.
5. Initial confirmation of your order will be sent out once order is received.
6. Study guides are available on our website: www.grandtheater.org/education.
7. An invoice with additional information is sent out 6 weeks before the performance. Payment is due upon receipt to confirm seating arrangements. Loss of seats may occur if payment is not received prior to the performance.
8. Refunds are issued only if a performance is cancelled or if your school is closed by the administrator on the day of the show. No refunds will be given for unused seats the day of performance.
9. Performances sell out quickly. Avoid missing out by returning your order form as soon as possible. Orders will be processed in the order that they are received.

The Performing Arts Foundation is dedicated to serving schools, teachers, and students of the region through educational and cultural experiences, and works closely with local and national partners in fulfillment of that mission. Through the ASPIRUS Arts in Education Series, The Grand brings curriculum-based performing arts to our area's students, exposing students to the arts, social studies, language arts, math, science, and more. The series ensures the arts remain accessible to our youngest patrons in public, private, parochial, and home schools.

Workshops - Bring visiting artists to your school prior to their main stage performance at The Grand.

Residencies - Multi-day stays by visiting artists prior to their performance consisting of workshops, outreach programs and much more.

Outreach Program - Workshops that take place in the community, that are open to students and the public.

Access to the Arts - Makes it possible for students who cannot afford a ticket to still participate. If a teacher certifies a student cannot afford a ticket, we will cover the cost with our Access to the Arts Scholarships.

Artists In The Schools - A resource provided to area schools of professional artists throughout the Midwest that bring these specialized artists into the classroom.
