The great American songbook comes to life in a concert celebrating the history of jazz... and its future



Wausau gets a big taste of New York City's famed Jazz scene, in a rare opportunity to hear historic jazz and blues performed live by world-class musicians and singers. **Jazz at Lincoln Center Presents: Songs We Love, on Wednesday, Feb. 15**, will delight you with the most soulful selections of America's great songbook, from Ma Rainey, Billie Holiday, Judy Garland, Frank Sinatra, and more.

The repertoire covers songs from the 1920s through the hard bop of 1950s jazz. This was one of the most significant eras in music history, when jazz artists changed the landscape of what music could be and whose work still influences performers and songwriters today. You'll hear gems such as the traditional blues "See See Rider" first recorded in 1924 by Ma Rainey. Billie Holiday's "God Bless the Child," a ballad first recorded in 1941, was celebrated in 2001 as one of the Songs of the Century by the Recording Industry Association of America and the National Endowment for the Arts. The

program also includes jewels by George Gershwin ("I Loves You Porgy"), Cole Porter ("So in Love"), and Harold Arlen ("Over the Rainbow," sung by Judy Garland in 1939).

The performers on stage – a six-piece band and three vocalists – represent the rising stars of the jazz world today. Musical director Riley Mulherkar has been recognized as a "smart young trumpet player" by The New York Times and is the recipient of the 2020 Lincoln Center Emerging Artist Award for his work as a bandleader, composer, arranger, educator, and advocate of the arts.

"We have a very close-knit group of musicians from Jazz at Lincoln Center," Mulherkar told the Calgary Herald when Songs We Love began its 2022 tour. "We've pretty much grown up together over the past 10 years, coming of age in the city playing at jam sessions at Dizzy's Club... I think the show encapsulates the best of that, of our generation and our community."

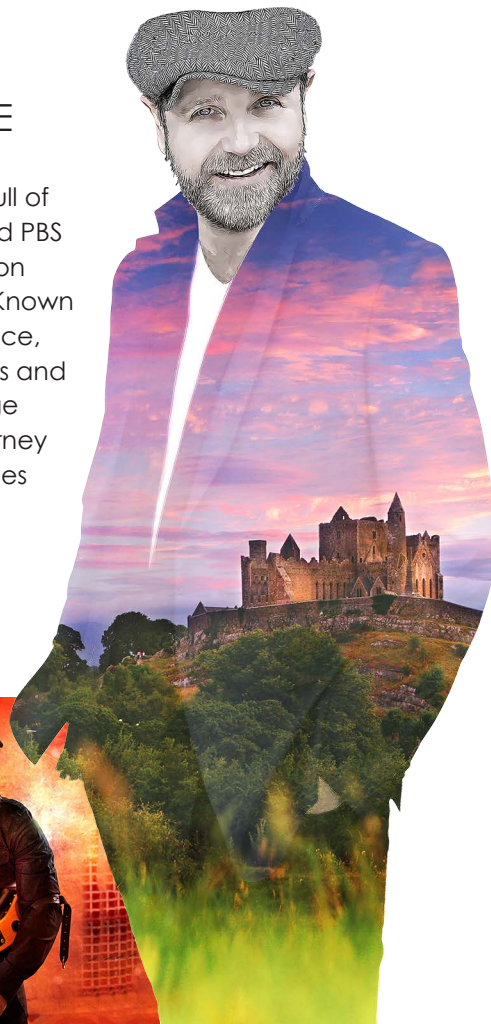


IRELAND WITH MICHAEL LIVE
